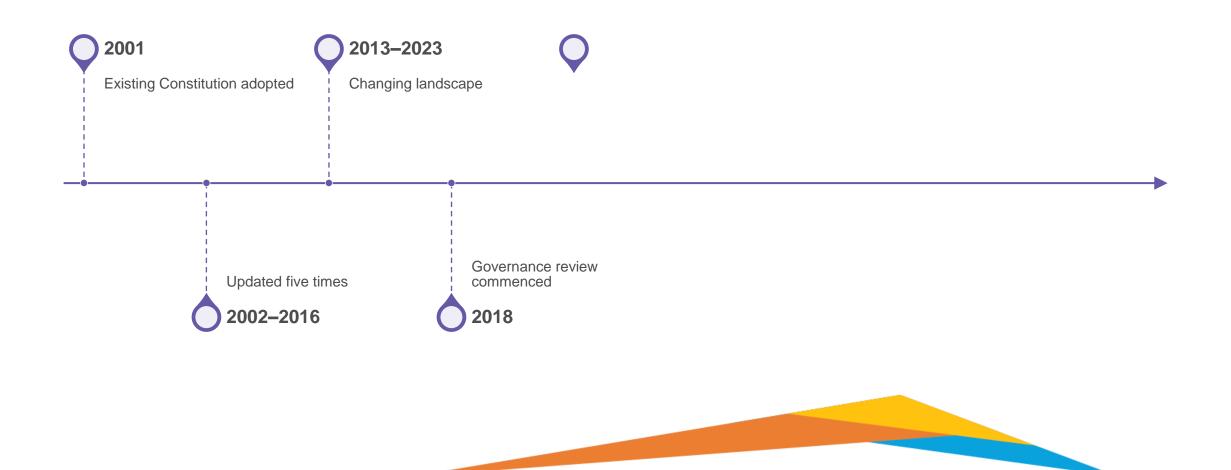
Why are we here

Overview of proposed changes

- Simplify **membership** categories and structure
- Re-establish Family Support Groups
- Establish Client Advisory Groups
- Form Area Advisory Groups
- Develop the National Chairs Advisory Group
- Revise the **Board composition** and **election/appointment mechanisms**

Membership

Purpose

Refer to: Constitution Rules 4.1, 4.2, 4.7, 4.8 and 7.7

Simplify membership to make joining easier and ensure **all** members can participate fully in the Foundation's governance.

Category changes

- A single membership type: Voting Member.
- No new admissions to Honorary and Life Members (retain rights).
- Affiliate and Corporate Membership discontinued.

Details

- All members vote in all Director elections (currently Area Committee only).
- Application no longer requires two supporter members.
 - Families automatically qualify (others need to show legitimacy).
- Members to approve annual membership fee (currently Board).

Strengthen member value proposition

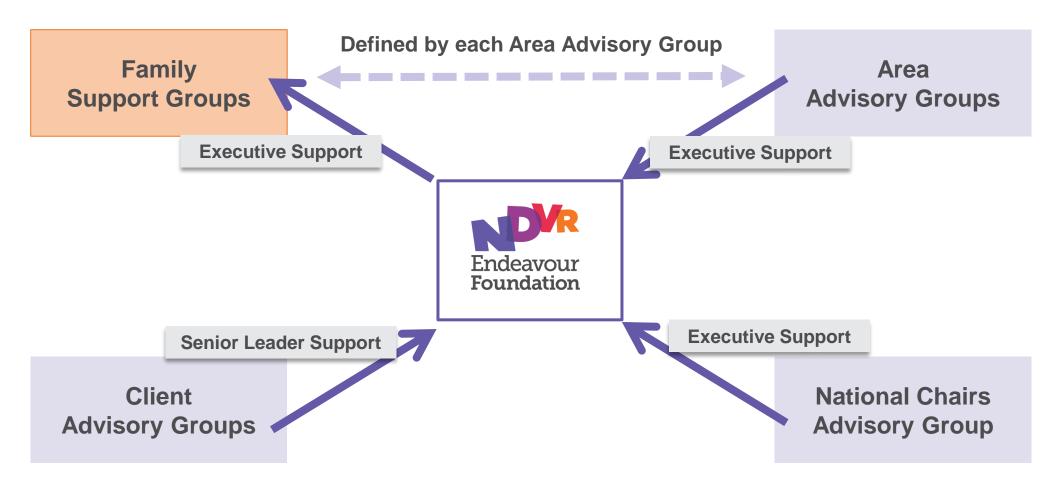
Refer to Constitution Rules 4.7, 4.8, 7.7, 7.13 and 7.18

All members have a right:

- To attend and be heard at member meetings
- Vote for **all** elected Director positions
- Vote for fee structure/fees for membership
- Vote for the total pool amount (if any) Directors may be paid
- Remove 1 or more directors from office at any time.



Understanding the relationships



The Constitution requires the Board to establish and maintain one or more Area Advisory Groups

Family Support Groups

Purpose

- A platform for families, carers, guardians, and advocates of clients to connect.
- Opportunity to provide educational topics.

Operational details

- Set up family support groups.
- Promote to families, carers, and guardians.
- Extend invitations as needed Open the group to members and others facing care challenges.

Support

- Accountable Executive.
- Area Advisory Groups determined by each group.

Client Advisory Groups

Refer to:

- By-Law 4 and 5
- Constitution Rule 13

Purpose

- Provide feedback and guidance on client-related matters.
- Incorporate client voice into Endeavour Foundation's work.
- Assist with easy-reads, advocacy and new services.

Operational details

- 4 meetings per year.
- Participation based on relevance to the service they receive.
- Members supported to understand discussions and contribute.

Support

- Senior Management Steering Committee.
- Complex Support Team.
- Accountable Executive.

Area Advisory Groups

Refer to:

- By-Law 2
- Constitution Rule 13

Purpose

- Local knowledge, contacts and support to assist the Foundation achieve its objectives.
- Providing advice on opportunities for the Foundation and feedback on local issues of concern.

Role

Will be flexible to harness the energy, knowledge and contacts of each group. Groups may:

- · operate local family support groups;
- aid family members', guardians', carers of Clients navigate critical issues through appropriate management channels as per Foundation policies;
- · identify potential new members, directors or volunteers;
- Assist with local Foundation activities.

Area Advisory Groups

Operational details

- Current Area Committee members appointed (same areas).
- Appointment for 3-year terms.
- Must be a member of Endeavour Foundation.
- All Directors will be ex-officio members of all Area Advisory Groups.
- Maximum tenure for Chairs of 9 years + 2-year transition.
- Minimum of 4 meetings per year.
- Support Family Support Groups as defined by each group.

Support

- Accountable Senior Executive.
- Endeavour Foundation representative at each meeting.
- Board Directors attends minimum of one meeting per year.

National Chairs Advisory Group

Refer to:

- By-Laws 4 and 5
- Constitution Rule 13

Purpose

- National forum for knowledge exchange.
- Assist Chairs of Area Advisory Groups to fulfil their roles.
- An avenue of advice and input to the Foundation.

Operational details

- Chairs of Area Advisory Groups automatically appointed.
- If a Chair cannot attend a meeting they may nominate an alternative.
- Minimum of two meetings per year.
- Chair of Board and CEO or their nominee to attend.

Support

Accountable Senior Executive

Board (Proposed Constitution)

Refer to: Constitution Rules 7.2, 7.5, 7.7 and 10.16

Board composition

- 4 to 5 Elected Directors.
- 0 to 5 Appointed Directors.
- Elected Directors nominated by 2 members and voted by ALL members.
- All Directors must be a member of Endeavour Foundation.
- Chair does not have a casting vote.

Board (Proposed Constitution)

Refer to: Constitution Rules 7.5, 7.6, 7.18 and 11

Directors' duties

• Directors' duties made explicit due to changes in Charity Law imposing responsibility on the Foundation.

Maximum director tenure

- 9 years (+3 years for Chair if appointed in third term).
- Incumbent Directors who have served more than 9 years shall retire from office no later than 2025 AGM.

Remuneration

• Subject to member vote in advance – Constitution + Member vote.

Board (By-Laws)

Refer to:By-Law 7Constitution Rule 12.5

Transparent nomination process

- Clear and open process for Appointed and Elected Directors.
- Elected Directors do not need to be a member of an Area Advisory Group but MUST be nominated by two members.

Establish a Nominations Committee

- Appointed by the Board (required by the Constitution).
- Comprising at least 2 directors, 1 external member and 1 member from the National Chairs Advisory Group.
- Evaluate candidates against Board Composition and Eligibility Requirements.
- Provide recommendation to the Board.



Board (By-Laws)

Refer to:

- By-Law 8
- Constitution Rules 4.2 and 7.5

Board Composition and Eligibility Criteria

Must demonstrate they are a bona fide supporter of the Foundation.

- Lived experience requirements.
- Representation from Board designated regions
 - Currently SE Qld, Regional Qld, NSW and Vic
- Required and desired skills and capabilities.
- Demographic diversity requirements/aspirations.
- Must be a member of Endeavour Foundation.

Proposed Director appointment process



Modernising aspects

We must address some matters irrespective of the remaining changes:

Directors' duties

• Explicit due to changes in Charity Law imposing responsibility on the Foundation

Director composition and selection

- 9 year limit on Director tenure
- Nominations Committee (with National Chairs representation) for rigorous Director appointment

Remuneration

 Members have the authority to approve payment of directors' fees to the Board – to recognise time and accountability of Directors.
